Before deciding to marry it is important to ask 'Am I free to marry in the eyes of the law and in the eyes of the Church?' If you were married before civilly or in the church then you may not be free to marry. It is important to discuss this matter with your priest.

If you are free to marry then congratulations on deciding to marry. A wedding ceremony does not have to be expensive and lavish. There is an assumption that a church wedding is always big and lavish and a civil wedding ceremony is small and inexpensive. A church wedding ceremony can be small, affordable and simple. It is the trimmings that make it very expensive, the flowers, the photography, the attire, and the reception. As you plan your wedding day try to be shrewd and practical.

Weddings in the parish of Monaghan and Rackwallace are celebrated in the Cathedral and St. Michael's Church, Ardaghey. Weddings in the Cathedral normally take place at 12.30p.m.or 2.30p.m. - to cater for two weddings. However, should there be one wedding booked on that day the couple three months prior to the date of the wedding may decide a time between 12.30 and 2.30pm.

A couple planning to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage is required to:

- give at least 3 months notice of the intended wedding to a priest of the parish.
- give at least 3 months notice to your nearest Civil Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages in your area. Any one getting married in the County Monaghan jurisdiction should contact the Civil Registrar of Births, Marriages and Deaths, Civil Registration Office, Monaghan Local Care Unit, Rooskey, Monaghan, 047 30444. It is strongly advised that you contact the Registrar to book an appointment. Bring with you to the registrar
  - a birth certificate
  - passport
  - o final divorce decree if you have been married before
  - a death certificate of spouse if you were married before and your spouse died
  - o PPS number
  - o names and dates of birth of witnesses
  - o name and address of the priest officiating at the wedding
  - venue of marriage
- complete a marriage preparation course. In the pre-nuptial enquiry form there
  are questions to be answered by the party getting married 'after an appropriate
  course of instruction.' The marriage preparation course offered by Accord is the
  course recommended by the Bishops, (see <a href="www.accord.ie">www.accord.ie</a> for course details or
  contact Accord Monaghan at 047-83359 or e-mail:
  <a href="mailto:accord.monaghan@eircom.net">accord.monaghan@eircom.net</a> Check church notice boards for dates and times
  of workshops).
- The course is an opportunity for you both to spend precious time together with which you can get to know each other more and name your goals and aspirations.
- Complete a pre-nuptial enquiry form with his or her priest. For completion of this document you will need a Baptismal certificate, dated within 6months of the wedding, Confirmation cert and a letter of freedom.

Both partners are required by law to

- 1. be at least 18 years of age
- 2. not be related by blood or marriage
- 3. have the mental maturity to understand and live out the marriage commitment
- 4. not be married to someone else

## **Marrying Abroad?**

- give at least 5 months notice to the parish in which you are resident. The parish abroad in which intend to get married requires that you complete all documents showing that you are legally and canonically free to marry.
- contact the General Register of Ireland at 72/76 St. Stephen's Green, Dublin 2.
  The General Register will advise you how to ensure that your marriage abroad

## **Wedding Rite without Mass?**

There are circumstances where it may be advisable to celebrate your wedding without a Mass, especially if your answer is yes to the following questions:

- Are you as couple familiar with the Mass? Are you and your guests familiar with the responses, know how to participate in the Mass fully?
- Is the Catholic partner marrying someone who is of another denomination and faith? Is Holy Communion likely to emphasise difference rather than unity between the Catholic and their partner?
- Is the Catholic partner marrying someone who is an atheist?

In the above situations a wedding liturgy without a Mass may be a more sincere and meaningful expression.

## **Music at your wedding:**

It is the policy of the parish that the music at your wedding be strictly sacred/church music. Pop music is forbidden during the religious ceremony. However, it is possible to have something more secular after the ceremony during the signing of the civil marriage registration certificate.

Mary's words to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you!', invites the couple to live according to the Law of Christ)

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of James said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said, 'Woman why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now,' he told them, 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink, but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.



## **Catholic Rite of Marriage**

The Rite of Marriage consists of THREE elements;

- Address Formulary
- Declaration of Consent
- Blessing of Rings

There is a variety of forms of each which you are free to choose.

#### Address Formulary I

Priest: Dear children of God, you have come to this church so that the Lord may seal your love in the presence of the priest and this community.

Christian marriage is a sacred union which enriches natural love. It binds those who enter into it to be faithful to each other for ever; it creates between them a bond that endures for life and cannot be broken; it demands that they love and honour each other, (that they accept from God the children he may give them, and bring them up in his law of love).\* To help them in their marriage the husband and wife receive the life-long grace of the sacrament.

*Is this your understanding of marriage?* 

R7. It is.

#### Address Formulary II

Priest: Dear Bride and Groom, you have come to this church so that the Lord may seal your love in the presence of the priest and this community. Christ blesses this love. He has already consecrated you in Baptism; now, by a special sacrament, He strengthens you to fulfil the duties of married life. You are about to celebrate this sacrament. Have you come here of your own free will and choice and without compulsion to marry each other?

R7: We have.

Priest: Will you love and honour each other in marriage all the days of your life?

R7: We will

Priest: (Are you willing to accept with love the children that God may send you, and bring them up in accordance with the law of Christ and his Church?

R7: We are)\*

#### Address Formulary III

Priest: Dear children of God, you have come today to pledge your love before God and before the Church here present in the person of the priest, your families and friends.

In becoming husband and wife you give yourselves to each other for life. You promise to be true and faithful, to support and cherish each other until death, so that your years together will be the living out of the pledge you now make. May your love for each other reflect the enduring love of Christ for his Church.

As you face the future together, keep in mind that the sacrament of marriage unites you with Christ, and brings you, through the years, the grace and blessing of God our Father. Marriage is from God: he alone can give you the happiness which goes beyond human expectation, and which grows deeper through the difficulties and struggles of life.

Put you trust in God as you set out together in life. Make you home a centre of Christian family life.

The Christian home makes Christ and his Church present in the world of everyday things. May all who enter your home find the presence of the Lord; for he has said: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them."

Now, as you are about to exchange your marriage vows, the Church wishes to be assured that you appreciate the meaning of what you do, and so I ask you:

Have you come here of your own free will and choice and without compulsion to marry each other?

R7: We have.

Priest: Will you love and honour each other in marriage all the days of your life?

R7: We will

Priest: (Are you willing to accept with love the children that God may send you, and bring them up in accordance with the law of Christ and his Church?

R7: We are)\* To be omitted if, for example, the couple is advanced in years\*

## <u>Declaration of Consent Formulary I:</u>

Priest: I invite you then to declare before God and his Church your consent to become husband and wife.

Groom: Do you consent to be my wife?

Bride: *I do. Do you consent to be my husband?* 

Groom: I do. I take you as my wife, I give myself to you as your husband.

Bride: I take you as my husband and I give myself to you as your wife.
